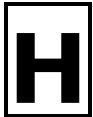

- Our own Eric Beuerman absolutely enthralled the audience with his piano acumen. Major Eric [WI-NG], in addition to being the Head and Professor of Military Science for UWSP ROTC, has his doctorate in piano from the University of Arizona. His Doctorate in Music Arts required four recitals: solo qualifying, ensemble, solo and lecture-recital. His dissertation was titled: 'The Evolution of the Twenty-Four Prelude Set for Piano'. He entertained us with five pieces including an appropriate holiday set. What talent!
- Mrs. Lorie Liss, Pacelli INTERACT advisor, presented their 2011 Annual Report of Activities. The club officers were tied up in classes and testing so Lorie gave their report. Lorie was the first and only Pacelli advisor for INTERACT. The 25 INTERACT students, who are also members of a number of other Pacelli student groups and activities, had been involved in dozens of activities in our community. Noteworthy are the Senior Citizen programs at various senior centers which include the Senior Proms [a dance and food for the seniors], letters and gifts to deployed troops, meals for Place of Peace and Salvation Army, CAP service programs, special mentoring and teaching assistance at local schools, and the capstone 'in-service' day with all Pacelli students, faculty and many, many volunteers provide a wide variety of community services: bell ringer at 'all' Salvation Army sites, more than 35 service sites, home visits and senior assistance in addition to 45 caroling locations. Their 'Caring Tree' brings small gifts to seniors in assisted living locations throughout the community. This December 22 all day events will touch the lives of hundreds in our community, especially seniors and homebound. This is the 9th Annual All Service Day and the 10th year Lorie has guided INTERACT. This year even a number of alums will be participating as volunteers.

When Bill Simmermon joined the Rotary Club of Highlands Ranch (Littleton), Colorado, USA, six years ago, he wanted to be an active member without sacrificing time with his family.

- 1 - Is it the TRUTH?
- 2 - Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3 - Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4 - Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?
