- Jim Anderson of our Club was a recent recipient of a special award from Justice Works for his volunteerism and support.
- Four main JW programs are: Volunteers in Probation Programs; Family Law Information Center; Community Education and Outreach; and, Conflict Resolution Center.

- **The mission of JW is to foster forms of justice that strengthen and heal communities of Central Wisconsin. The focus is:**
 - **Community involvement in sentencing issues**
 - **Rehabilitation assistance to offenders**
 - **Victim/offender conferencing**
 - **Mediation services**
 - **Family law resources**
 - **Justice issues education to schools and communities**
 - **Coordination of community services to the judicial system**
- **A new program called T.E.A.M. [Teamwork for Employment Access] through Mentoring is a new reentry monitoring program based on successful offender-mentoring, VIP [Volunteers in Probation].**
 - **The main focus is reducing the return of incarcerated persons to the prison system. 91% of PC inmates are repeat offenders; 60% are locked up four or more times.**
 - **Ex-offenders don't successfully reintegrate into our community.**

The beat goes on to end polio

River Cities Jazz performs at the Montreux Jazz Festival in Switzerland, during the band's tour in support of polio eradication.

River Cities Jazz, a 19-piece band based in Wisconsin Rapids, Wisconsin, USA, toured the United Kingdom, France, and Switzerland in late June and early July 2010, performing nine concerts that raised about \$20,000 for Rotary's US \$200 Million Challenge.

"In addition to raising money for polio eradication, this tour was the first time that the band has performed internationally, [including] the Montreux Jazz Festival, one of the premier jazz festivals in the world," says band leader Mitch Biba, who plays trumpet and flugelhorn and is a member of the Rotary Club of Wisconsin Rapids.



By staying in Rotarians' homes, band members got a true taste of other cultures and formed new friendships, he adds.

The only Rotarian in the band, Biba says he got the idea for a jazz tour to benefit PolioPlus while leading a District 6250 Group Study Exchange team to the Philippines in 2009.

"I met Les Wilson [Rotary Club of Maghull & Aughton, England], team leader for a District 1180 GSE in the Philippines at the same time. One of our discussions included his district's fundraising dance for polio eradication," Biba says.

During the discussion, they decided to "make this crazy idea a full-fledged tour." Biba is hopeful the band will raise an additional \$15,000 for the challenge.
