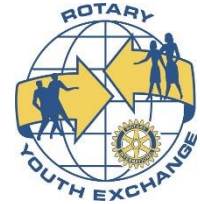

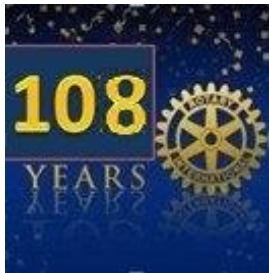

- Portage County to Host Wisconsin Farm Technology Days [FTD] in 2014.

 - The Visitors Bureau expects more than 80,000 over the three days, August 12-14, 2014.
 - Hundreds of volunteers will be needed for this \$1.3m event. \$250k will be raised by the host committee to showcase local businesses. All donations are tax deductible.
 - This could be a fundraiser for StePt Rotary.
 - Many details are being ironed out over the next few months.
 - This is a key event to showcase Portage County both in and out of Wisconsin.

Speakers – Riverside House Update by current and a former member

- Self-help For Sobriety Without Relapse is the motto of the Houses; the first Oxford House was founded in Silver Spring, MD in 1975 by a recovering A&DA man; there are now more than 1200 similar houses nationwide separately for men and women. There is a men and a women house in StePt and one to be started in WR.
- Patti Cahill and husband Tom started the Riverside House some nine years ago modeled after the highly successful Oxford Houses for A&DA persons seeking a positive

environment for rehabilitation. This is the third presentation by members of the House describing their background, positive aspects of the House environment and individual growth during their residency.

- House members are self-selected and self-governing. They share in all chores and costs. A member must leave the house if they relapse for any reason on alcohol or drugs.
- Our speakers included a former member who left the house voluntarily and serves as a continuing mentor.
- All members work outside the home.
- This program continues to be very successful due to self-governing and the desire of many to join the program. But it takes a lot of mental courage to continue and follow through.

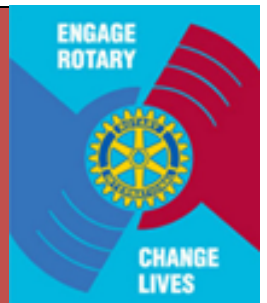
