Presenter Rev. Brian Konkol

- Brian, his wife Kristen and their new son Khaya Tews are home for an almost 2 month visit with family and friends. He is Project Co-Coordinator, South Africa Young Adults in Global Mission Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- '97 Amherst HS grad went on to Viterbo University and had worked for Ellis Stone for a couple of summers. His father worked for Ellis for more than three decades. But the construction business was not in Brian's future. Attending Viterbo on a basketball and academics scholarship majoring in criminal justice in his 3rd year he switched to the Lutheran seminary, had met his future wife who was a Lutheran minister's daughter. But Brian took his first posting to Guyana, South America [the former British Guiana colony]. By pure chance, the Peace Corps posted Kristen to Guyana a year or so later

and the rest is history. They married in 2006 and were posted to South Africa near Haymarket in 2007.

- They now work with 12 congregations; Brian continues his love of basketball to reach local youth.
- Brian is now working on his Ph.D. through a local S. African university.
- Their post in S. Africa is in the cradle area of human kind – a rare place to say the least. Preserving the antiquity is a major problem for the area.

- The church is frequently a stronger influence than external diplomacy.
- Apartheid is banned but the effects are still evident in ownership of land and resources, arrangements of communities, etc There is a Rotary club about two miles away and Kristine's father is a Waupaca Rotarian.
