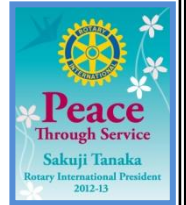

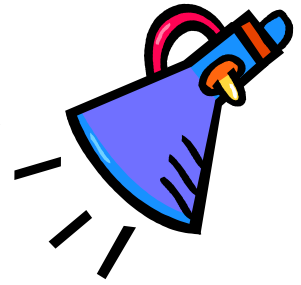

- 50-50 Raffle – Somebody, not sure who

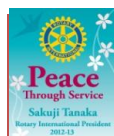
Presenter: Layne Cozzolino, ED, Central Rivers Farmshed

- Farmshed began in 2007 as a study of a regional food system with the goal of knowing who our local farmers are and to educate citizens so that they know more about their food.
- Farmshed instituted a beginning farmer course
- Works with the Salvation Army Hope Meals
- Produces the Central Wisconsin Farm Atlas
- Made it possible for redemption of EBT at the Farmer's Market (formerly known as the Food Stamp program)
- Increased awareness of nutrition in the local schools with Farm to School program (fundraisers for schools where students are selling food items produced locally)
- Started the Greenhouse Project in former Sorenson's Greenhouse. Based on "Growing Power" out of Milwaukee – indoor gardening and a change of the urban landscape to provide access to local food
- Started a partnership with the Boys and Girls Club to teach leadership and engage youth in entire food system production
- Many community collaborations in place and many more planned
- Will kick off membership drive on Black Friday
- Want to volunteer? Farmshed needs people with time, willingness to attend the many events offered and also they need tools, so if you are cleaning out your tool shed, think of Farmshed!

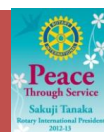
