**Presenter** Since this was a Club Assembly, President Rick invited Pat Bradley, Wausau Noon to give a short take on his personal experiences with the Rotary Foundation. Pat is principal with Bradley/Whalen Investments but is not his club's RIF chair.

- A 22-year Rotarian, Pat recognizes that it is through the RIF that we connect world-wide.
- RIF facilitated the synergy of Rotary, the many projects, Group Study Exchanges, Ambassadorial Scholars, humanitarian projects as Polio Plus, RYE and all our other initiatives utilizing the contributions of many for the world humanity in more than 160 counties on seven continents.
- Arch Klumph, the first President of Rotary International, witnessed the first contribution to the Rotary Foundation, \$26.50 which in today's dollars would be \$500. Now contributions to RIF have exceeded \$1 billion.
- One RIF target is a new contribution to RIF by every Rotarian every year – EREY. Although the amount is less important than everyone's contributions, the target is \$100 per Rotarian Every Year. A Rotarian can become a sustaining member by contributing \$100 per year and

after the tenth year becomes a Paul Harris Society member. There are now more than 1,274,000 PHF world-wide.

## From Rotary International - October - Vocational Service Theme

Vocational Service focuses on:

- Adhering to and promoting the highest ethical standards in all occupations
- Recognizing the value of all useful occupations, not just those that are pursued by Rotarians
- Contributing one's vocational talents to meeting the needs of the community

During October, Rotary clubs are encouraged to consider: Vocational Service, including [The Four-Way Test](#) and [The Declaration of Rotarians in Business and Professions](#). After expanding members' awareness, solicit their input in planning projects for the remainder of the year; introduce a "classification talk" series in which each member gives a five-minute talk on his or her vocation. These presentations give members the chance to learn the inner workings of jobs other than their own, including the various problems that arise and the solutions used to address them; Help young people prepare for their careers by sponsoring a character building project, career day, job shadowing day, or mentorship program. Support professional development in the community by sponsoring a professional networking event or workshop, or start a career counseling program to help unemployed or underemployed adults compete in the job market. Have club members volunteer their vocational skills on a community or international service project. Many volunteer opportunities can be found on [ProjectLINK](#), an online database that allows Rotary clubs to publicize projects in need of assistance.
