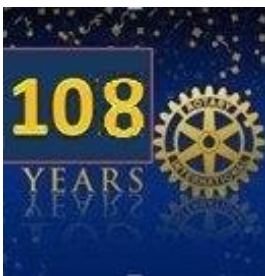

Program Presenter – RYLA returnees and Coordinator Brenda Diamond

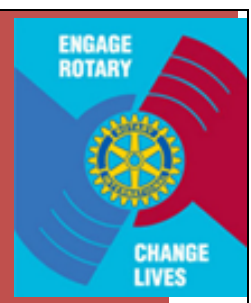
- Brenda made a great presentation of what RYLA is all about and the importance to develop leaders in the community.
