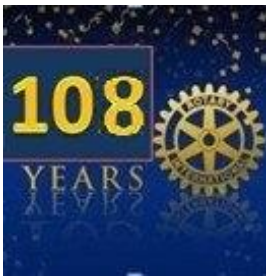

Program: Ned Grossnickle spoke on the Central Wisconsin Chapter of Citizens Climate Lobby.

The goal of the Citizens Climate Lobby is advocate for a sustainable climate and to build political support throughout the state that will lead to meaningful changes to combat climate change.

- Dan Dieterich is the current chairperson of the group. The Central Wisconsin Chapter was formed in August, 2012.
- The group meets monthly at the Schmeckle Reserve board room on the first Saturday of every month.

- In addition to explaining the revenue-neutral carbon tax, Ned mentioned several areas regarding Climate change during his talk.
 - CO2, oceans and coral reefs
 - Ocean absorption of CO2 has led to chemical changes in seawater and mass coral bleaching, etc.
 - Health effects
- The burning of fossil fuels contributes to four of the five leading causes of death in the United States, including heart disease, cancer, stroke, and lung diseases, while putting children at risk of asthma and delayed mental development. “Carbon free today will keep the doctor away”
- Science denied. Scientists by a margin of 1000 to one believe that CO2 causes climate change
- “Fossil fuel” jobs versus “renewable” energy jobs. Ned Grossnickle reported that in 2010, there were a total of 174,000 permanent coal-related jobs nationwide, and 806,831 oil and gas jobs as of 2011. By contrast, there were 3,129,112 green jobs in 2010. The Department of Energy predicts using conservative estimates that by 2030 there will be over half a million wind jobs alone

- Cliff King - two great customer conferences, one in Texas and one at WI Dells

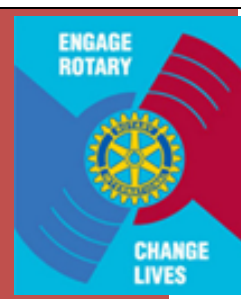
