Presenter Terry Arnold provided a cryptic update on polio eradication worldwide. Rotary and all our partners are certainly making progress but there are some hinderances to full eradication.

- 23+/- countries have sporadic polio although only 4 are considered having endemic polio.
- The problem is classification – Endemic – cases and sources local; re-established – cured but reinfected; imported – victim came in to the country from another [this is the majority of cases even for the U.S.]. Real problem is the mobility of the world's population.
- Rotary's program founded in 1985 and has been immensely successful although the last few locations are so hard.
- Slow down of immunizations may lead to too frequent reoccurrences.
- Ultimately Rotary expects to have contributed \$1.2 billion to the eradication program

## **From Rotary International - Celebrating New Generations Month**

Every year, thousands of talented and dedicated young people, ages 12-30, have an incredible experience in a New Generations program.

- As ROTARACTORS and INTERACTORS, they serve in communities at home and abroad.
- Through Rotary Youth Exchange [RYE] *they explore new cultures as part of summer or full year exchanges.*
- And as Rotary Youth Leadership Awards [RYLA] participants, they learn skills that will help them succeed as future community leaders.

**New Generations is Rotary's fifth [and newest] Avenue of Service enhancing the classic Avenues of Club, Vocational, Community and International.**

**THE TRADITIONAL FOUR AVENUES OF SERVICE** is frequently used in Rotary literature and information. The "Avenues" refer to the four elements of the Object of Rotary: Club Service, Vocational Service, Community Service and International Service. Although the Avenues of Service are not found in any formal part of the constitutional documents of Rotary, the concept has been accepted as a means to describe the primary areas of Rotary activity.

- "**Club Service**" involves all of the activities necessary for Rotarians to perform to make their club function successfully. This includes the Secretary, Treasurer, Sergeant, Membership Development, Club Bulletin, Public Relations.
- "**Vocational Service**" is a description of the opportunity each Rotarian has to represent the dignity and utility of one's vocation to the other members of the club. It also includes programs such as Pride of Workmanship, Shine On Awards, Vocational Talks, Vocational visits to work places, Peer Support Program, Awards Nights.
- "**Community Service**" pertains to those activities which Rotarians undertake to improve the quality of life in their community. It frequently involves assistance to youth, the aged, handicapped and others who look to Rotary as a source of hope for a better life. Programs include; liaising with other community groups, Australian Rotary Health program, Bowelscan, Drought Relief and Bushfire Recovery, Environmental Water Management, Road Trauma campaign, Walking Tall.
- "**International Service**", describes the many programs and activities which Rotarians undertake.

- 2 - Is it FAIR to all concerned?**
- 3 - Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?**
- 4 - Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?**
